PEDIATRIC WORKFORCE SHORTAGES PERSIST IN 2024

The Children's Hospital Association (CHA) assessed the current pediatric workforce vacancies and appointment wait times at children's hospitals across the country in the fall of 2023. The results show continued shortages across pediatric care fields with an outsized impact on mental and behavioral health specialties.

Pediatric Physician Vacancies Continue

Children's hospitals reported pediatric physician vacancies in a number of critical specialties. Shortages in the top six areas along with the percentage of hospitals experiencing vacancies, are listed below.

shortages reported as most severe are in neurological, behavioral, and mental health specialties.

Pediatric non-physician workforce professional areas are facing major or severe shortage according to a third or more of children's hospitals.

Pediatric physician shortages and longer wait times are linked

Nine clinical areas had wait times over 10 weeks. Notably, the top three specialty areas experiencing longer wait times are also the three areas with the highest vacancies.
