

# State Telehealth Policy Actions

Many states expanded the availability of telehealth services during the height of the COVID-19 pandemic since it offered wide-ranging opportunities for improvements in health care delivery to better meet the needs of patients. The landscape of telehealth policy continues to evolve as policymakers evaluate the benefits of telehealth.

## Key Highlights

- The majority of states have expanded Medicaid coverage for telehealth via audio-only and virtual means.
- Many states have implemented interstate compacts and interstate licensure laws to increase telehealth access.<sup>1</sup>
- Expanding access to behavioral health services via telehealth continues to be a priority for many states.

The chart below provides a high-level overview of how each state currently covers and reimburses telehealth services under Medicaid based on information collected from the [Center for Connected Health Policy](#) and the [Federation of State Medical Boards](#). The following telehealth categories are included in the chart: reimbursement for live video, remote patient monitoring and audio-only under Medicaid;<sup>2</sup> interstate licensure waivers;<sup>3</sup> interstate compacts;<sup>4</sup> prior consent requirements; and states' behavioral health services flexibilities.<sup>5</sup> Bolded items highlight policies that are specific to behavioral telehealth services for children.

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<sup>1</sup> Interstate compacts are a way for states to adopt exceptions to full in-state licensure for telehealth providers and allow providers to participate in multiple states through one approval process. The other state must also be a compact member, and the provider must hold a license in good standing in their home state. Interstate licensure laws may apply to physicians, nurses, and other allied health professionals, such as social workers.

<sup>2</sup> Medicaid payment rates for live video, remote patient monitoring and audio-only are not always at parity with in-person.

<sup>3</sup> Some states have telehealth-specific exceptions that allow an out-of-state provider to render services via telemedicine in a state where they are not located, even after federal COVID-19 emergency waivers have expired.
